Application Checklist for Native Access Program

Admission Requirements

In order to be eligible for admission consideration for the Native Access Program, you must be a mature student of Aboriginal, Inuit or Métis ancestry.

All applicants must complete an application package. The application package has five parts:

- The Native Access Program application form
- Personal Resume with two references
- A letter (approximately 250 words in length) which answers the following questions:
 - Why do you want to attend the Native Access Program?
 - How has your previous education prepared you for the Access Program?
 - What program or programs are you thinking about entering upon completion of the Access Program?
- Official transcript(s) from all postsecondary institutions currently or previously attended as well as official high school transcripts
- A scheduled interview

What is the NAP?

Lakehead University's Native Access Program (NAP) is a nine-month program designed to assist you in making a successful transition to university by providing you with enriched supports and programming.

NAP may be for you if...

- you are of Aboriginal descent
- you are a mature student who does not meet the general admission requirements to Lakehead University
- you require additional academic support and skills to become eligible for admission to University-level programs.

Setting You Up for Success

- NAP is designed to provide you with the academic preparation to help you succeed in a University degree program.
- You will take foundation courses in English, Mathematics, Science, University Transition and Indigenous Learning.
- You will have access to tutoring, personal counselling and a culturally sensitive support network designed to create an environment where you can reach your goals.

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Frequently Asked Questions

Native Access Program

- **Q:** What does the program cost?
- **A:** You will pay the regular tuition and compulsory fees associated with your program. There are no additional fees for partcipation in the Native Access Program.
- **Q:** Will I receive any University credit for the NAP Program?
- A: Yes. Those who successfully complete the program, earn full-course equivalents (of university credits) and may be considered for admission to a regular Lakehead University Degree program^{*}. University Transition I and II are non-credit and mandatory courses.

- **Q:** Will I receive any credit for my previous post-secondary education?
